Citation:

“for the development of high-Q, miniature FBAR resonators that are producible in large quantities, and of which billions have been produced.”


W. G. CADY Award

Professor John Hartnett, University of Western Australia

Citation:

“for the construction of ultra-stable cryogenic sapphire dielectric resonator oscillators and promotion of their applications in the fields of frequency metrology and radio-astronomy.”
